## CRIMINAL ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the year of 2013, Officers made the following criminal arrests:

- 87 adult (+20.83%)
- 4 juvenile (-63.63%)

## TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the year of 2013, Officers issued the following:

- 458 traffic citations (+24.79%)
- 1307 motor vehicle warnings (+32.69%)
- 310 safety Equipment Repair Orders (+41.55%)
- 366 parking citations (-3.68%)

Officers also responded to 117 motor vehicle collisions. (+30%)

The Redspeed Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) Camera issued 1903 Traffic Citations.

## COMPLAINTS / INCIDENTS

During the year of 2013, Officers responded to a total:

- 4834 incidents (+15.06%)
- 17 emergency petitions. (0%)
- During the year of 2013, there were a total of 26 K9 deployments. (-7.14%)

## **2013 Agency Accomplishments**

1. January 2013 – Implemented new CPD Administrative and Patrol Manual and agency personnel operated in accordance with updated rules and regulations. Continually revised and updated agency personnel, disciplinary, operational orders and reporting forms in accordance with current state law and recent court decisions.
2. Implemented, supported and monitored operation of the Automated Speed Enforcement System (Speed Camera) resulting in issuance of 1903 speeding citations.
3. Increased operational efficiency through training and by updating currently used technology and incorporating new technology, such as in-car computerized Electronic traffic enforcement, and Automated Crash Reporting.
4. Increased Cross jurisdictional information sharing and collaboration with allied law enforcement agencies and other governmental entities, resulting in numerous arrests and case closures. For example:
  - Long term narcotics investigations involving the Queen Anne's County Drug Task Force
  - Armed robbery investigations involving numerous allied police departments
5. Increased enforcement of quality of life crimes, resulting in the issuance of 458 traffic citations, 1307 written warnings, 310 Safety Equipment Repair Orders and 49 traffic arrests.
6. Provided enhanced patrol coverage by constantly adjusting personnel shifts utilizing alternative work day schedules and overtime in an effort to ensure a minimum of 2 patrol officers on duty 24 hours a day, everyday.
7. Responded to an increased number of calls for service (4834), as a result of an increase of officer initiated activity as part of our community policing efforts.
8. Replaced both agency K9 dogs due to age and obtained required training and certification for new dogs.
