CRIMINAL ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of October 2015, Officers made a TOTAL of 16 CRIMINAL ARRESTS:

Fourteen (14) Adult Arrests:

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY
