CRIMINAL ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of June 2016, Officers made a TOTAL of 8 CRIMINAL ARRESTS:

Two (2) Adult Arrests:

- 1 Warrant Service for 2nd Degree Assault
- 1 on-view for CDS

Six (6) Juvenile Arrests:

- 2 for Trespassing
- 3 Poss. Of CDS
- 1 for 1st Degree Burglary

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of June 2016, Officers issued the following:

- 15 Arrestable Traffic Citations, including:
 - 2 for Driving Under the Influence
 - 4 for Driving on a Suspended/Revoked License
 - 2 for Driving w/o License
 - 7 for other arrestable offenses
- 55 non-arrest able Traffic Citations
- 270 Motor Vehicle Warnings
- 20 Safety Equipment Repair Orders
- 33 Parking Citations

The Redspeed Automated Speed Enforcement Cameras located on Kidwell Avenue and Chesterfield Avenue issued a combined 105 Traffic Citations.

NOTABLE CASES

- 6/3 @ 610pm Officers were dispatched to the Dollar General Store for a reported Armed Robbery that had just occurred. After officers arrived on the scene, it was determined that the suspect entered the store and grabbed a female employee while producing a knife and threatening her with it and demanding that she open the cash register. The employee complied and after stealing currency, the suspect immediately fled the store, to a waiting vehicle in the parking lot and fled the area. There were at least 4 customers in the store when the robbery occurred, as well as multiple store employees, however, no one was injured.

Officers from the Centreville Police Department who were working the case interviewed multiple witnesses and obtained quite a few evidentiary leads which ultimately lead to the identity of the suspect, Michael C. Chamberlain, 27, who was arrested at approx. 1130pm in Millington, MD by the Kent County Sheriff's Office on unrelated charges.

- 6/14 @ 226 pm Officer Lannon attempted to stop a vehicle for speeding at MD. 213 @ Oak St. when the vehicle failed to stop and a short pursuit ensued. The vehicle stopped at a residence in the NorthBrook neighborhood, where the driver and a juvenile exited and ran from the vehicle. Additional police units from the Centreville Police Department and the Queen Anne's County Sheriff's Office arrived on location and assisted in the search for the suspects, when the juvenile passenger was located and apprehended, who then provided the identity of the driver as Austin Dale Wilson, 26 of Church Hill, MD.

Due to the vigilance of the NorthBrook community, the Centreville Police Department received numerous calls and tips from neighborhood residents, which ultimately led to the location and arrest of the suspect.
