CRIMINAL ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of May 2016, Officers made a TOTAL of 6 CRIMINAL ARRESTS:

Two (2) Adult Arrests:

- 1 Warrant Service for FTA
- 1 on-view for CDS

Four (4) Juvenile Arrests:

- 1 for Theft less than \$100
- 1 for MDOP
- 2 for Poss. Of CDS

Two (2) Adult Civil Citations issued for poss. Of Marijuana less than 10 Grams. *(Now a civil violation instead of criminal)*

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of May 2016, Officers issued the following:

- 25 Arrestable Traffic Citations, including:
 - 1 for Driving Under the Influence
 - 6 for Driving on a Suspended/Revoked License
 - 1 for Driving w/o License
 - 17 for other arrestable offenses
- 60 non-arrest able Traffic Citations
- 299 Motor Vehicle Warnings
- 33 Safety Equipment Repair Orders
- 18 Parking Citations

The Redspeed Automated Speed Enforcement Cameras located on Railroad Avenue and Chesterfield Avenue issued a combined 93 Traffic Citations.
