CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

During the month of August 2011, the department made seven (7) adult arrests, 5 for Assault, 1 for Driving Uninsured and 1 for Driving on a Suspended License. The department made one (1) juvenile arrest for a Runaway. The department investigated 34 Part I and II crimes.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of August 2011, the department issued 35 traffic citations, including 2 traffic arrests, 98 motor vehicle warnings and 20 equipment repair orders for a total of 154 citations, warnings, and equipment repair orders. The department issued 19 expired meter violation citations and 13 incorrect parking citations for a total of 32 parking violations. The department responded to 9 motor vehicle accidents.

MISCELLANEOUS COMPLAINTS / INCIDENTS

During the month of August 2011, the department responded to 380 miscellaneous incidents. The total of all service calls for the month of August was 423.
