CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

During the month of September 2011, the department made nine (9) adult arrests, 3 for Assault, 2 for CDS, 1 for Theft, 1 for VOP, 1 for FTA and 1 for Telephone Misuse. The department made one (1) juvenile arrest for MDOP. The department had 3 Emergency Petitions and investigated 39 Part I and II crimes.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of September 2011, the department issued 20 traffic citations, including 2 traffic arrests, 77 motor vehicle warnings and 37 equipment repair orders for a total of 136 citations, warnings, and equipment repair orders. The department issued 10 expired meter violation citations, 2 restricted parking citations and 9 incorrect parking citations for a total of 21 parking violations. The department responded to 13 motor vehicle accidents.

MISCELLANEOUS COMPLAINTS / INCIDENTS

During the month of September 2011, the department responded to 407 miscellaneous incidents. The total of all service calls for the month of September was 459.
