CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

During the month of May 2011, the department made eleven (11) adult arrests, 4 for theft, 2 for DWI, 1 telephone misuse, 1 driving w/o license, 1 trespassing, 1 violation of probation and 1 MDOP. The department made eight (8) juvenile arrests, 2 for CDS, 3 for possession of alcohol, MDOP and disorderly conduct, 1 for assault, 1 for theft and 1 for disrupting school. The department investigated 41 Part I and II crimes.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During the month of May 2011, the department issued 70 traffic citations, including 5 traffic arrests, 195 motor vehicle warnings and 22 equipment repair orders for a total of 287 citations, warnings, and equipment repair orders. The department issued 24 expired meter violation citations, 10 restricted parking citations, 9 incorrect parking citations and 1 handicap zone violation citation for a total of 44 parking violations. The department responded to 10 motor vehicle accidents.

During the month of May 2011, the department responded to 405 miscellaneous incidents. The total of all service calls for the month of May was 456.
