

**TOWN COUNCIL OF CENTREVILLE
ORDINANCE NO. 02-2018**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF CENTREVILLE TO AMEND THE
TOWN'S VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC ORDINANCE CODIFIED AS CHAPTER 154 OF
THE TOWN CODE, IN ORDER TO ADMINISTER AND ENFORCE THE TOWN'S
VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC ORDINANCE MORE EFFECTIVELY.**

WHEREAS, Section 5-213 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland authorizes the Town Council to establish reasonable parking regulations.

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of the Town will be furthered and enhanced by clarifying certain terms within the Town's Vehicle and Traffic Ordinance, which is codified as Chapter 154 of the Centreville Town Code, in order to aid in the administration and enforcement thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Town Council of Centreville that:

Section 1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this ordinance.

Section 2. Chapter 154-2 Parking Restrictions:

F. No vehicle shall be parked in a town owned, leased or managed parking lot for longer than the time indicated as identified by signage.


G. No vehicle shall be parked in an unmetered parking space for longer than the time indicated on a sign identifying the parking space as time restricted.

H. No vehicle shall be parked in a spot designated for restaurant pick-up for longer than the time indicated on a sign identifying the parking space as time restricted.

I. Notwithstanding any prohibition on parking set forth herein, in times of utility construction or repair to roads in Town, the Town may issue permits to residents to allow parking in restricted parking areas during periods of utility construction or repair to roads.
